TOP TIPS - RAIN + GOLF

Know the Rules

It's vital to understand the rules that apply to rain-affected areas of the course. Excessive rain can cause small areas of the green, fairway and bunker to become flooded. These areas are described as "casual water" in the rulebook. If there's casual water directly between your ball and the pin when you are putting, you can reposition the ball - but no nearer the hole in the process.

In The Bunker

If your ball lands in casual water you can lift it out and drop it on the nearest dry area without penalty. In a bunker the nearest point of relief must be in that same bunker – and not the nearest dry point on the fairway or green.

Swinging in the Rain

As well as having the correct wet weather equipment you must also be aware of swing problems caused by wet conditions. A normal swing is difficult in a wet-weather suit. The extra weight and additional layers restrict the body movement. Don't try to overcome the problem by forcing your swing. Keep your normal tempo and make a three-quarter swing if it feels easier.

The key is to maintain your concentration and tempo in the rain. This may be harder than you think. A wet fairway slows down the roll of the ball, so many players wrongly increase the speed of their swing to compensate for reduced length. This is often disastrous. When the course plays long, take one more club than usual and concentrate on keeping the same tempo as always. It's particularly important to play within your limits in damp conditions. Never gamble.

SUPERINTENDENT NEWS

The Ground staff team have been busy in the off season completing maintenance jobs in preparation for next summer. The focus shifts from frequent mowing on turf grass surfaces to machinery, irrigation and vegetation work. With a recent spate of sub-zero overnight temperatures, the soil temperatures are below 10 degrees Celsius and all couch grass areas are fully dormant.

Our back up river water supply pumping station has been overhauled and rebuilt to avoid a repeat of last summer when we were low on irrigation water for several days due to our submersible groundwater pump malfunctioning. This should keep us in good stead for years to come with all irrigation pumps and major components being inspected and necessary preventative maintenance carried out.

Our irrigation holding tanks and bowling green irrigation tanks have been cleaned out to remove any iron deposits and other sediment on the bottom. Other irrigation jobs are being carried out including replacement of on course air release valves faulty heads and adjusting sprinkler arcs.

Other jobs that have been carried out by Ground staff have been;

- Broadleaf weed spraying, particularly in roughs
- Bunker base leveling and sand added where needed
- Tree trimming and shaping
- Sand and seed added to uneven areas in roughs
- Bunkers with steep entry and exit points modified and improved
- Herbicide application under trees for weed control

This time of the year with high rainfall we need ropes on course to direct traffic and carts away from damp areas. Some fairways, particularly those in an east/west direction

e.g. 6 & 7 don't see any sun this time of the year with large Casuarinas blanketing out any UV light and not allowing soil to dry out once wet. If golfers can be proactive in avoiding driving through wet areas and generally protecting the golf course this time of the year, it makes things better for everyone. It was discussed at Greens Committee level to step up the Gypsum program to help improve the soil structure therefore resulting in better drainage.

Some recent infiltration test conducted on fairways at various depths in the soil show that it is only the top 100-120mm that's is sealing up and not allowing water to infiltrate naturally. This issue is being address and monitored frequently. There can also be some changes in conditions if there is a large frost and there is ice on the greens, this can result in tee off times being slightly delayed until conditions improve to minimize damage occurring.

Some new sturdy seats have been put on the course, fabricated by the Howlong Men's Shed with more currently being built to replace other seats past their use by date.

In October this year capital works will commence to upgrade the Croquet Courts. Surface level will be rectified and a possible laser level done if funds allow. A Clubs NSW Grant has been received for \$19,000 for funding of this project. A full out line of works will be in the November Newsletter.




