PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would like to commence this report by wishing every Member a wonderful 2018 and thanking you for your loyalty and support over the last year. 2017 has been a challenging year with a substantial reduction in revenue from our gaming section, and large increases in electricity and insurance costs – fortunately these difficulties have been slightly offset by gains in all other sections of our resort. I would like to thank our General Manager, Operations Manager and staff for their sterling effort in achieving as a small profit despite these challenges, which will be announced in our Annual Report.

In an endeavour to maintain the momentum towards a further profit in 2018 the Board has instructed the General Manager and Operations Manager to seek other avenues of revenue improvement and cost savings, and any decisions in this regard will be announced as implemented. We thank you for your understanding, as the staff are working to ensure that strategic improvements are made so that Howlong Golf Resort remains successful for another 90+ years.

It has been drawn to my attention that members are using Social Media as a forum to voice feedback about the Resort that is not constructive. We welcome constructive feedback and value your views. Whilst changes are being implemented we hope members understand that staff and the board have the members best interest in mind and are making well thought out strategic business operations.

On a positive note congratulations must go to the MDGA Junior Squad who made it to the

semi-finals, what an amazing result. I would like to thank the support team, which included Janet Rogers, Penny Graeber and Steve Philiponi for their contributions. We are so proud of the young talent in the region. Keep up the great work!

As the Bowls Classic gets underway I have heard many positive comments about the quality of the bowling greens, which is a credit to our bowls volunteers who now perform the work on the greens. My congratulations to Wally and his team for their hard work.

Members will have noticed that Szeto Asian Kitchen has commenced service and despite some minor teething problems the standard of meals is outstanding. I can personally recommend the Crispy Beef and Special Fried Rice.

A new motorised Bunker Rake is now in operation and players should reap the benefit if unlucky enough to find a bunker. Please remember to repair your footprints as you leave and place the hand rake in the centre of the bunker parallel to the fairway. We have all be frustrated by our ball not finding the centre of a bunker as a result of an improperly placed rake.

If members have any ideas, thoughts or feedback about the golf course, please direct them to the Director of Golf, General Manager or Operations Manager. The Superintendent and his staff have been approached by members with some minor complaints. We have given our members notice about the proper communication channels, and hope that this will not continue in future.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

It has been a busy summer on course to date for the ground staff team. Humidity and heat combined with the requirements for heavy irrigating have meant more mowing than previous summers is required. Selective chemical are being used to control growth rates on certain areas to avoid excessive growth and buildup of clip from the mowers.

Some recent feedback from golfers has been that the bunkers have been packed down and not as fluffy as usual. A recent addition to our fleet of machinery is a Kubota Baroness Mechanical Bunker Rake (pictured right). This will improve the bunker presentation and will be used twice weekly in conjunction with hand raking to improve bunker playing conditions. Some of our older bunkers do not drain sand well and are on the priority list to be rebuilt as capital funds allow. This will also save in labour and free up staff to attend to other jobs required.

Some other additional pieces of machinery the club has invested in as part of its Machinery Capital Replacement plan are a new Toro GR3250 Greens mower and a Toro MDX workman runaround vehicle. Previous machines used in this role have either been stepped down or traded in. Our fleet of equipment is vital to presenting the golf course to a high standard with minimal breakdowns and maximum efficiency.

Other jobs the ground staff have been attending to besides general mowing are Kikuyu control in all closely mown areas, weed control under trees, insect, beetle, poa and fungus control in greens, bunker base leveling, and debris removal in roughs.

We will be putting the word out for volunteers to assist with on course working bee's in the next month. With the recent reduction in groundstaff numbers we ask members to get involved to assist with tasks such as garden bed clean-ups, tree trimming and debris raking and removal in the roughs. This has worked well in the past and will improve the overall



presentation of the course. It will be a weekly event to be followed by refreshments in the clubhouse. A coordinator will be nominated to work with the course Superintendent to get this reinstated.

Our new team of volunteers lead by Bowls Manager Wally Bourne have made some really positive inroads to what is all new to them. The club congratulates these members for the results being achieved on the bowling greens and encourages extra helpers to jump onboard to spread the workload. The greens are shaping up well for the annual invitational classic on the 7-8 February which is another sold out event.

I encourage golfers to be as vigilant as possible in repairing pitch marks on greens correctly as many are visible on par 3 greens and shorter par 4 greens. We have a sand dusting program in place to also help alleviate this and improve ball roll.

We have used approximately 70 megalitres of ground water on course this season out of a possible 209 megalitre entitlement.

The fairways were like carpet in most areas, green and lush, and the sun broke through the clouds regularly, making it a pleasant walk if you could avoid the wind. The Murray DGA played against Northern Rivers DGA in a battle of the North v South of NSW in the second semi-final (Dubbo GC played against Bexley GC in the first semi-final). 
